



The EBIR Contributors' Pathway – Terms and Conditions

1) General Information

CIRSE members who wish to support the European Board of Interventional Radiology (EBIR) have to apply to the EBIR Examination Council by submitting the **Declaration of Interest** form, available for download at www.cirse.org/ebir. Upon review and agreement by the Council, the applicant will be invited to one of the item writing / case writing workshops held regularly on the occasion of the examination.

Applicants may choose to support the EBIR either by functioning as **MCQ Contributor** or **Case Contributor**:

MCQ CONTRIBUTOR	CASE CONTRIBUTOR
MCQ Contributors will take part in the MCQ writing workshop and submit MCQs for a minimum of one year (at least 2 written examinations). Every MCQ contributor will be asked to provide 20 MCQs per year (10 per written examination).	Case Contributors will take part in the case writing workshop and submit cases for one year (at least 2 oral examinations). Every case contributor will be asked to contribute 4 cases per year (2 cases per oral examination).

2) Eligibility

Applicants must be EBIR holders.

3) Council Membership

Members who have served at least one year as MCQ or case contributors, will be **eligible for examiner training**. Invitations by the EBIR Examination Committee will be issued through the CIRSE Office. Members who wish to train as examiners, will attend an **examiner training workshop**.

Members qualify for Council Membership after having completed examiner training and having functioned as MCQ and/or case contributors. Invitations by the EBIR Examination Committee will be issued through the CIRSE Office.

4) Reimbursement

Your contribution to the EBIR Examination is of great value to the IR Community and highly appreciated by the CIRSE leadership. Please consider that no financial reimbursement can be granted to EBIR MCQ/Case Contributors and examiners for the time of their training.

5) Confidentiality requirements

EBIR questions and cases are highly confidential and it is strictly forbidden to pass on any examination material to unauthorised persons. Submitted cases and questions will pass into intellectual property of the Cardiovascular and Interventional Radiological Society of Europe (CIRSE). By signing the declaration of interest, MCQ and case contributors pledge to not disclose any confidential information directly or indirectly (orally or in writing) to any third parties.
